In 2009, the County of Westchester entered into a Consent Decree in connection with a lawsuit filed by the Anti-Discrimination Center of Metro New York, Inc. ("ADC"). A hearing has been scheduled in this action for May 23, 2016, pursuant to scheduling orders of March 18, March 23, April 1, and April 26. Final submissions in advance of that hearing are due on May 19 at 5:00 p.m.

On April 28, 2016, the Monitor filed his Third Biennial
Assessment of Westchester County's Compliance with the Consent
Decree. That report raises several issues and contains requests
for relief from the Court. In a letter of May 11, the ADC
requests that the Court find the County in contempt of its
obligations under the Consent Decree and impose a seven year
period for the County to achieve compliance with those
obligations. Among other things, ADC proposes that the Court
determine whether it is futile to seek compliance from the

County with respect to certain provisions of the Consent Decree and whether a Special Master should be appointed to act in its place. The issues raised in the April 28 report and the ADC letter are largely beyond the scope of the issues to be addressed at the May 23 hearing. Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED that, by May 25, the Monitor shall identify any specific requests for relief arising out of his April 28 report.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties and the Monitor shall file submissions addressed to the following:

- 1) The requests for relief in the Monitor's May 25 submission;
- 2) Whether the Court should accept the ADC's May 11 submission as an amicus brief; and
- 3) Whether any of the requests for relief presented in the ADC May submission should be granted, whether or not the ADC filing is accepted as an amicus brief.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the following schedule for these submissions shall govern, unless the parties and Monitor present a proposed alternate schedule by May 20 at noon. The County's submission shall be due June 10, the Government and the Monitor's submissions shall be due June 17; the County's reply shall be due June 22 at noon.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a conference on the issues

raised in the ADC's letter and identified in the Monitor's May

25 submission shall be held on June 24, 2016 at 2:00 p.m.
